The Gaia Centre Code of Ethics

The Gaia Centre Code of Ethics is defined by eight core assumptions we believe to be true about human nature and our relationships to the world. It is through the lens of our beliefs that we shape our reality and the way in which we see ourselves and others in the world.

1. Core assumptions - what we believe to be true

- The true self in everyone is good, wise and powerful.
- The world is profoundly interconnected.
- All human beings have a deep desire to be in good relationship.
- All humans have gifts and a higher purpose, and everyone is needed for what they bring.

- Everything we need to make positive change is already here.
- Human beings are holistic our minds, bodies, emotions and spirits are in all that we do.
- We can use practices to build habits of living from the core self.
- The Earth is a living system of consciousness.

2. Trust

We are committed to building trust within the community through honesty, authenticity, respect, transparency and compassion.

3. Loving Self-Responsibility

In honoring ourselves and one another, we are committed to self-care and loving self-responsibility to acknowledge and address any issues as they arise within ourselves or in our relationships with others. We have an agreed Conflict Resolution Process that we are committed to invoking as needed.

4. Holding Space

We are committed to holding space for the personal, professional and spiritual development of members in our community. We do this by following these broad guidelines as much as possible:

- 1. Respecting confidentiality creating a safe space requires trust and without confidentiality there can be little trust.
- 2. Being present in the moment The present is the only point of creative power and the only point where personal change can happen. Share where you are right here and now.
- 3. Speaking truth from the heart Use 'I' not 'You' or 'We' statements.
- 4. Owning your own feelings you are responsible for your feelings and there is no need to carry the feelings of others.
- 5. Talking less and listening more learn from the silences and spaces between words and actions. Silence can be a great teacher.
- 6. Staying around when times get tough this is the time for great insights and personal growth. Sit with your or another's discomfort and speak to the group if you want to leave. You will be giving them a great gift.
- 7. Taking responsibility for the health of the group. Blaming, shaming or criticizing others is hurtful.

8. Deep listening to 'hear' and feel what the other is saying. It's not about fixing or solving others' problems. Use the opportunity to explore rather than solve.
